
PROF. DR. CLIVE NAPIER Portrait of a Gentle Giant

CLIVE THE MAN

Prof. Dr. Clive Napier was born on 17 May 1950 in Boksburg. A divorcee at his passing on, he is known to be having a sister - Cynthia - his only surviving relative.

ACADEMIA and WORK

Prof. as he was affectionately known obtained a BA degree in Political Science and Economic History at the University of Natal in 1974. He then completed his first year studies towards LLB while in the Department of Hospital Services in Pietermaritzburg.

In 1976 he attained a Master's degree in African Politics at the George Washington University in Washington DC. USA. Returning home, he joined the National Archives Repository in Pietermaritzburg where after he took up a post at the University of Transkei in Mtata. Prof then became a researcher at the Institute of Race Relations, where after he joined Unisa. At Unisa, where he remained until his retirement nearly 7 years ago, earning a Ph.D and later an appointment as a Professor.

POLITICS

According to Malcolm G. Ferguson, Prof's life-long friend, Prof. became a political activist from his first year at university. His political journey stretches from "the defunct United Party, through the Progressive Party, up to the DA" - his final political home. He joined the DA Tshwane Caucus on 05 Dec. 2000, and remained a Councillor up to his last living day.

Today, as we mourn his untimely departure, we also honour and celebrate his dedication, selflessness and unwavering commitment towards the empowerment and development of others. A total tower of strength and a servant leader.

Throughout this journey, Prof distinguished himself for his deep conviction and extraordinary diligence.

Even from his sick bed in his final days, Prof was cautioning us all about the seriousness and danger of Covid 19. He implored us to do everything possible to stay safe. Reportedly, Prof passes on while he and friend Malcolm were thinking of starting a Household Food Security Project for Covid 19 affected families in Tshwane!
